Na data de 01 de fevereiro, tive a grata satisfação de receber o convite do Sr. Marion Barthelemy, *Director of Division for Public Administration and Development Management, Department of Economic and Social Affairs*, para participar, como observador da Décima Sexta Sessão do *Committee of Experts on Public Administration of the United Nations Economic and Social Council (ECOSOC)*, na Organização das Nações Unidas, em Nova Iorque, no período de 24 a 28 de abril de 2017 (Anexo I).

Autorizado pela ECOSOC, pela decisão 2016/257, de 27 de julho de 2016, o tema para debates foi "Assegurar a efetiva implementação dos Objetivos para o Desenvolvimento Sustentável: lideranças, ações e meios", assim subdivididos:

1. Compreender as necessidades das autoridades locais e das comunidades e capacitando-os para a implementação dos Objetivos de Desenvolvimento Sustentável;
2. Liderança institucional e Metas de Desenvolvimento Sustentável;
3. Disposições institucionais para os Objetivos de Desenvolvimento Sustentável;

Os debates integraram a 16ª sessão da Comitê de Especialistas em Administração Pública – CEPA, que é composto por 24 peritos selecionados pelo Secretário-Geral da ONU e referendados pelo Conselho Econômico e Social – ECOSOC. As reuniões ocorrem anualmente e acompanho suas atividades, em razão



de meu currículo (anexo II), há 15 anos, sendo que, como parlamentar, desde o ano de 2012.



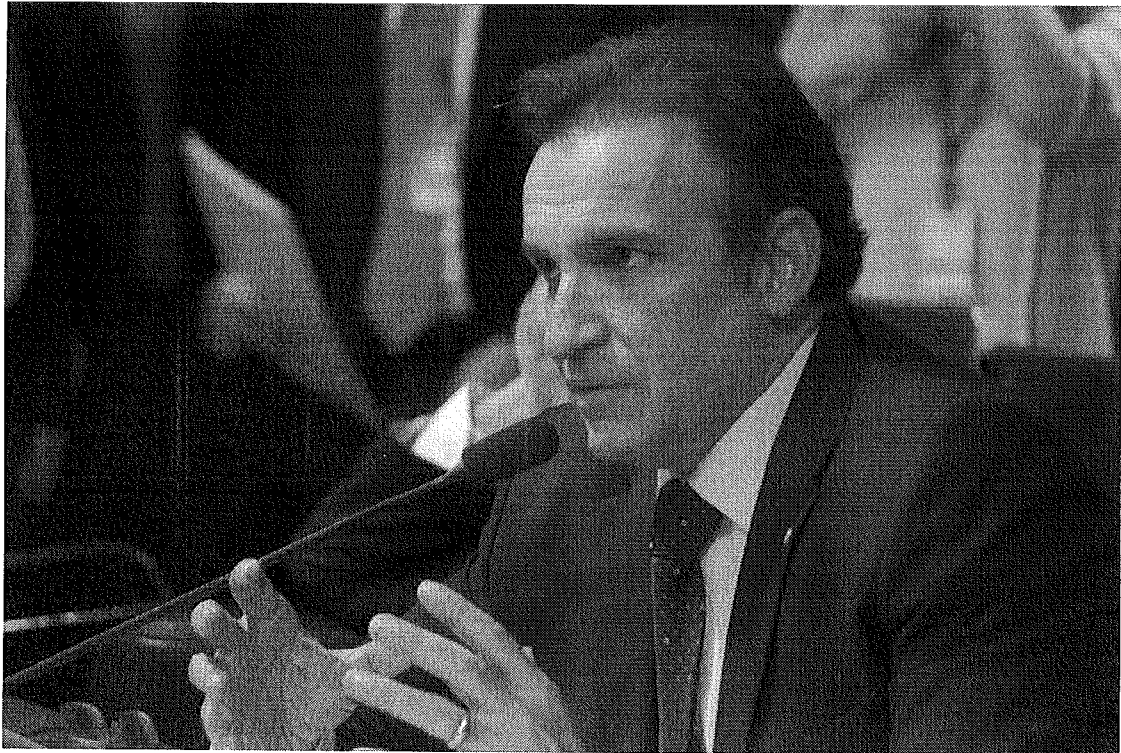

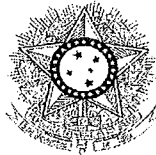
